


Final Instructions 2025

This demonstration charity sprint is organised by Staffordshire Clubs for Young People, registered charity N° 522814. The event is a celebration of motoring and runs will not be timed. As such, the event is not governed by Motorsport UK. The event is open to the public.

1. The Venue

Curborough Sprint Course is situated 1.5 miles off the A38 at Hilliards Cross (SP Fradley Park), between Burton upon Trent and Lichfield in Staffordshire. The venue is 'brown signed' once you are off the A38, and also from the A515 if approaching from the west.

The course does not have a specific postcode, but you can use the one for the nearest property which is WS13 8EJ. If you are entering an address in your Sat Nav the entrance is in Netherstowe Lane off Wood End Lane.



2. Access

Like last year, there will be no Paddock Pass, but if you could make a note of your run number from the entry list (see link provided) it will ensure a speedy check in at the Entry Gate and will facilitate finding your allotted spot in the Paddock. Please aim to arrive in good time for the Drivers' and Riders' Briefing which is at 8.45am. On arrival you will be given an envelope containing:

- a signing-on card to be signed and handed to the Marshals before your first run;
- your run number, which must be displayed on the front of your vehicle;
- your blue Entrant wristband;
- your green Passenger wristband entitlement. By default, there will be one green wristband per envelope, so please check that you have the correct number of green wristbands if you have ordered more; and
- a complimentary programme.

NB: You will only be permitted to run if your run number is clearly displayed on the front of the vehicle, and your Entrant wristband worn and visible.



The Paddock

Vehicles will be displayed in year order (and run numbers have been allocated accordingly). Paddock Marshals will direct you to your allotted parking space. If you have a trailer and support vehicle, please park them on the grass directly behind your allotted space. Like last year, the motorcycles will be grouped together. Double runs are requested to park on the side of the return road between runs and await instructions from a Paddock Marshal.

The Paddock will be open from 8.00am to 6.00pm. Please note that there is a speed limit of 10mph on site.

Paddock and Track Marshals will control the movement of vehicles in and out of the Paddock and from the Paddock to the entrance to the Track.

Access to the Paddock is not restricted so vehicles must be left in a safe condition and please do not leave any valuables unattended.

3. Timetable

We have a full entry, so it is critical that we adhere to the timetable insofar as possible to ensure that everyone gets their allotted runs. Please listen for announcements from Paddock Marshals so that you are ready to run at the appropriate time.

Sunday 24th August 2025

17:00 onwards Vehicle / trailer drop off. Overnight camping

Should you wish to drop off a vehicle and/or trailer on Sunday, overnight parking is available, either on the grass *opposite* the lavatory block by the entrance, or in your allotted space in the Paddock. Please do not arrive before 5.00pm as the venue has been booked by the Lotus Seven Club for their annual Clubman Sprint meeting. The gates will be closed overnight - but not locked – please make sure that you close them behind you. If necessary, David Pattison, Course Manager, can be contacted on 07976 878652. Overnight camping is permitted in the Paddock. There will be two large barbecues available from 6pm onwards for anyone who wishes to use them, situated next to the Sprinters Rest café.

4. Drivers' and Riders' Briefing

The Drivers' and Riders' Briefing is obligatory and will take place at 8.45am outside the Paddock Office.

5. Insurance

All Entrants must hold a valid driving licence and ensure that their vehicle is properly maintained in a road-worthy condition and that they have fully comprehensive insurance for their vehicle, driver(s) and passenger(s). Several insurance companies have amended their cover to exclude closed events such as this, even though it is non-competitive. It is your responsibility to check and ensure that you are comfortable with the cover that you have. The Organisers cannot accept responsibility to owners, passengers, or their vehicles on site during the event.

6. Entrant Contact Number

All Entrants must have a working mobile phone at the event so that they can be contacted if necessary.

7. Demonstration Runs

We aim to give each Entrant three runs unless unforeseen circumstances do not permit this. This is a non-competitive event; all runs are demonstration only and will not be timed. Passengers are permitted. Crash helmets are not obligatory but recommended in open vehicles.

The maximum noise level allowed is 105db.

The figure-of-eight course will be used. Once over the finish line, Entrants must slow down as quickly as possible and proceed along the return route back to the Paddock.





While on track all Entrants are under the control of the Track Marshals. Entrants must not start until given a signal by the Start Line Marshal. Only one vehicle will be permitted on track at any time. Entrants must drive in a responsible manner. Track Marshals are instructed to flag down anyone who, in their opinion, is travelling at an excessive speed or driving dangerously and anyone doing so will be prevented from completing further runs. If a Track Marshal shows a red flag then the Entrant must slow immediately, return to the Paddock and report to the Paddock Office. If a red flag is waved, the Driver must stop as quickly as possible and not re-start until given permission to do so by a Marshal.

Off track, please note that there is a 10mph speed limit everywhere on site and please heed the Marshals' instructions at all times for the safety of everyone present and to facilitate the smooth running of the event. We are carbon capturing the event with Tree-V, to offset the day's carbon tyre-print so that we can be happy in the knowledge that the environmental impact has been considered.

8. Static Displays

Pre-booked Static Display vehicles will be guided to the Static Display area on the slope beyond the commentary tower. Eligible vehicles which turn up on the day and pay at the gate may also park in the Static Display area, space permitting. Unless used as a tow vehicle, all modern vehicles will be directed to the public car park.

9. Refreshments

The Sprinters Rest café will be open all day and an ice cream van will be present from 12:00 midday onwards.

10. Dogs

Please note that dogs are permitted but <u>must be kept on a short lead at all times</u> and with owners fully responsible for any cleaning up required.

11. Disposal of rubbish

Please place any rubbish in the dustbins provided or take it home with you.
